FALL 2016 SPECIAL BULK AND YARD WASTE COLLECTIONS SCHEDULE

These collections are for occupied residential properties only.

	If your Normal Trash Day	Then your Special Collection Date
Fall Bulk Trash collection	is Tuesdays or Wednesdays	is Wednesday, November 16
	Thursdays	Wednesday, November 30
Fall Yard Waste Collection	Tuesdays or Wednesdays	Wednesday, December 7
	Thursdays	Wednesday, December 14

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS - What you need to know.

Regular household garbage is not part of these collections. Collection is for <u>residential properties</u> only; vacant lots, commercial, and industrial properties are not included. Items must be at the curb by 6:00 AM; materials placed for pickup at any other time may not be collected.

BULK ITEM COLLECTION

DO:

Include items such as: Furniture - Toilets and Sinks - Carpet - Mattresses - Tables and Chairs - Refrigerators - Washers & Dryers - Small appliances - Televisions - Microwaves - Computer Components

Small items must be placed in a container at the curb and weigh no more than 100 lbs.

DON'T:

Include items such as: Hazardous Waste - Construction materials - Paint - Yard waste/brush - Propane tanks - Tires - Chemicals - Insecticides

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

DO:

Place leaves, grass clippings, pine needles and cones, and garden waste in a paper or plastic bag, or (maximum) 30 gallon container.

Cut brush into 4 ft. lengths and bundles no larger than 18 inches in diameter.

DON'T:

Mix in stones, rocks, metal, other inorganic matter, dirt, sod or other materials.

The Berlin Board of Supervisors of Elections has announced the following schedule for the upcoming 2016 Municipal Election for Mayor and Council seats in Districts 2 and 3.

Please note: For all filing deadlines listed below items must be received by the date/time indicated. Postmark will not be accepted.

Absentee Voting: Applications to vote absentee are available at Town Hall, 10 William Street or by contacting Administrative Services Director Mary Bohlen at 410-641-4314 or mbohlen@berlinmd.gov. The following are the deadlines to apply:

- To apply by mail: Deadline is Tuesday, September 27, 2016.
- To apply in person at Town Hall: Deadline is 5:00 PM, Friday, September 30, 2016

Absentee Ballots will be accepted up to 7:00 PM on Election Day.

<u>Write-In Candidate Filing:</u> (name will not appear on ballot) 5:00 PM, Tuesday, September 27, 2016.

Election Day: Tuesday, October 4, 2016, 7:00 AM-7:00 PM.

Polling Places:

Districts 1 & 2 Voters: Buckingham Presbyterian Church, 20 S. Main Street.

Districts 3 & 4 Voters: Multi-Purpose Building , 130 Flower Street.

The Board of Elections Supervisors will meet on Tuesday, September 27, 2016 at 5:30 PM in the 2nd floor conference room at Town Hall. This meeting is open to the public.

Stytumn Health and Safety Tips

Follow these tips to help you and your family stay safe and healthy this autumn!

Keep your kids safe and healthy.

Get involved with your kids' activities at home and at school to help ensure they are safe and healthy.

Take steps to prevent the flu.

The single best way to protect against the flu is to get vaccinated each year in the fall. Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Wash your hands often. Stay home if you get sick.

Make Halloween festivities fun, safe, and healthy for trick-or-treaters and party guests.

Test and replace batteries.

Check or replace carbon monoxide batteries twice a year when you change the time on your clocks each spring and fall. Replace smoke alarm alkaline batteries at least once a year. Test alarms every month to ensure they work properly.

Keep food safe.

Food is center stage during the holidays. Be sure to keep it safe by following basic food safety steps. Clean hands and surfaces often. Separate foods to avoid cross-contamination. Cook to proper temperatures. Chill promptly.

Learn your family history.

National Family History Day is observed on Thanksgiving Day. Over the holiday or at another family gathering, talk about and write down the health conditions that run in your family. Learning about your family's health history can help you take steps to ensure a longer, healthier future together.

Be prepared for cold weather.

Exposure to cold temperatures can cause serious health problems. Infants and the elderly are

particularly at risk, but anyone can be affected. Know how to prevent health problems and what to do if a cold-weather emergency arises. Remember that using space heaters and fireplaces can increase the risk of household fires and carbon monoxide poisoning.

Don't drink and drive.

Alcohol use impairs skills needed to drive a car safely. It slows reaction time and impairs judgment and coordination. Alcohol-related motor vehicle crashes kill someone every 31 minutes and non-fatally injure someone every two minutes. Don't drink and drive, and don't let others drink and drive.

Wash your hands.


Keeping hands clean is one of the most important steps you can take to avoid getting sick and spreading germs to others. It's best to wash your hands with soap and clean running water for 20 seconds. If that's not possible, use alcohol-based hand rubs.
