Citizen Information Initiatives

The Town of Berlin and the Berlin Police Department want to remind Berlin residents that there are two programs in effect for Town citizens that could be of great assistance to those with special needs: The Special Needs Alert Program (SNAP) and the CodeRED Emergency Notification System.

Sponsored by the Berlin Police Department, SNAP is intended to aid Law Enforcement Officers in contacting and locating those with special needs such as, but not limited to: Alzheimer's, Autism, Down Syndrome, Dementia and those with impaired mobility, hearing and vision, including the elderly.

Clean-Up Day & Take Pride in Berlin Week

Show your pride for the National Championship Junior Varsity Berlin Seahawks Pop Warner Football Team

This annual event is the kick-off for Take Pride in Berlin Week, which runs from April 21-28, 2018. For more than a decade volunteers have dedicated a few hours on an April Saturday to help give Berlin's Parks and neighborhoods a spring cleaning. Individuals and teams are needed to help with planting, weeding, raking, mulching and whatever else needs attention. This is a great opportunity for students to earn service hours.

The main clean-up areas are Stephen Decatur Park on Tripoli St. and Henry Park on Flower St., as well as Berlin Falls Park on Old Ocean City Blvd. Clean-up of Hudson Branch will also be needed; this activity is not for young children. Heavy clothes and boots are recommended. For general park clean-up, sign up at any of the parks starting at 8:30 am; Hudson Branch sign-up is at Henry Park. Some supplies will be available for use, but participants are encouraged to bring their own if possible; rakes, shovels and wheelbarrows are always needed.

Lunch is generously provided by SonRise church at no cost to volunteers.

Volunteers can also choose to spend their time anywhere they feel needs attention. Trash pickup will be available; items for pickup will need to be placed in one location at the clean-up area and the Town must be contacted so that crews are aware of the need. On Saturday, the 21st, we will also be celebrating the 2017 National Champion Pop Warner Football Team, Berlin's own Seahawks. Joining the coaches, players and their families at Henry Park will be Power 101.7 to provide music for the event.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED?

- *GLASS-bottles and jars only. Rinse, remove lids, rings and metal attachments. Paper labels may be left on the jar or bottle. Not necessary to separate by color.
- *PLASTIC-any plastic container with the recycling symbol 1 thru 7. Rinse, remove caps, lids, rings or other attachments and crush to flatten. Paper labels may be left on the container.
- *ALUMINUM-drink cans and clean aluminum food containers or foil. Rinse.
- *FERROUS, TIN, OR BI-METAL-cans only (will stick to a magnet). Rinse.
- *PAPER-newspaper, magazines, "junk mail", office paper, etc.. Clean and dry, bundle with string or place in disposal bags in stacks of twelve (12) inches or less.
- *CARDBOARD-CORRUGATED ONLY. Same as paper

No special container is needed, however all items must be separated by type. Containers need to be sturdy enough to be handled and to identify contents. Bags can be used as long as sanitation workers can easily identify contents. Metal drums or containers larger than thirty (30) gallons are not allowed.

WHEN ARE COLLECTIONS SCHEDULED? General refuse (regular household garbage) will be collected once per week and recyclables once per week. If your trash day is Tuesday, then your recyclables will be collected on Monday, if your trash day is on Thursday, then your recyclables will be collected on Friday. In the event of a holiday, or other Town office closure, general refuse and/or recyclables will be collected on the next regularly scheduled day, unless otherwise scheduled. Any change in scheduling will be published in local newspapers, on the Public Access Channel (cable channel 4) and/or in the *Berlin Community News*. If you have any questions regarding the collection routes or the separation of recyclables from general refuse, please call Berlin Public Works at 410-641-4001.

BULK WASTE COLLECTION

DO: Furniture, large & small appliances, carpet & rugs, computer components. Place smaller items in a container.

DON'T: Construction materials, lumber, chemicals, paint, yard waste, tires.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

<u>**DO**</u>: Place leaves, grass clippings, pine needles and cones, and garden waste in a paper bag, plastic bag, or (maximum) 30 gallon container. Cut brush into 4 ft. lengths and bundle no larger than 18 inches in diameter.

DON'T: Mix in lumber, stones, rocks, metal, other inorganic matter, dirt, sod or other materials.

What To Do With Items on the DON'T lists above

The Worcester County Solid Waste Division offers the following information:

Paints and chemicals (cleaning solvents, pesticide, etc.) - Chemicals and oil-based paints: Store until the county has a disposal event. Water-based paint: Fill container with sand or kitty litter and dispose of in the trash.

Electronics: With the exception of laptops and computers, dispose of in the trash. Laptops and Computers: Recycling is available at the Berlin transfer station.

"Law Enforcement agencies across the US have implemented this type of program with great success. SNAP is available for individuals who live and work in Berlin, as well as those who frequently visit."

By completing a short form, individuals and caregivers of those with special needs provide the Police Department with crucial information to assist in providing the best care during emergencies.

The Town of Berlin also offers residents and businesses the ability to stay informed about what's going on in the Town through the CodeRED Emergency Notification System. "The Mayor and Council recognized the need to be able to communicate with our citizens quickly and efficiently," Mayor Gee Williams explained.

"The use of a mass notification system that can deliver messages by phone, email or text all at once and to many people will help us keep our residents, businesses and even visitors informed," the mayor added. Participation in the CodeRED system keeps residents informed of incidents such as power outages, road closures and other items which may affect the entire Town or specific areas.

Spring has finally arrived! 'Tis the Season for Property Maintenance

With the warming weather and longer daylight hours, we will all be out tending to our lawns, trees, and gardens. A few reminders for maintenance requirements from the Town Code:

- Please keep your grass cut less than 6 inches in height.
- Please remove all weeds and foreign growth from your property. This includes sidewalks, street stormwater gutters, along fences, and property lines.
- ◆ Trees with limbs overhanging neighboring properties should be trimmed.
- No clippings or yard waste are permitted to be blown or placed into the street or gutters.
- Please remove staining of the exterior surfaces of your home, including outbuildings and fences, caused by mold, mildew and algae.
- Exterior painted surfaces such as soffits, fascia, and trim, are to be kept free of peeling, cracking paint and wood rot. These surfaces and those on steps, porches, and decks are to be kept structurally sound.

Please take advantage of the upcoming Town's Bulk and Yard Waste Collection Days and follow the guidelines outlined on page 3 for dates and allowable items which may be picked up by Public Works.
