#### Town of Berlin Historic District Commission April 7, 2021

Chairman Carol Rose called the April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021 Historic District Meeting to order at 5:31PM. Member's present were Carol Rose, Mary Moore, Laura Stearns, Robert Poli and Norman Bunting. Staff present was Planning Director Dave Engelhart and Permit Coordinator Carolyn Duffy.

Chairman Carol Rose called for a motion to adopt the April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021 agenda. Mr. Norman Bunting made the motion to approve the April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021 agenda. Mrs. Mary Moore seconded the motion, and it was unanimously accepted by the commission. Chairman Carol Rose called for a motion to approve the minutes from the March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021 meeting. Mrs. Laura Stearns made the motion to approve the minutes from the March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021 meeting. Mrs. Mary Moore seconded the motion, and it was unanimously accepted by the commission.

Chairman Carol Rose called Case # 4-7-21-05 for Mr. Matt Borrelli, 119 North Main Street for signage. Chairman Carol Rose stated that Mr. Borrelli was opening a business called Sterling Tavern and was requesting signage. Chairman Carol Rose asked Mrs. Laura Stearns if she had any questions. Mrs. Stearns replied no it looks awesome. Mrs. Mary Moore liked the signage thought it was classic. Mr. Robert Poli agreed. Chairman Carol Rose called for a motion for Case # 4-7-21-05. Mr. Robert Poli made the motion to approve Case # 4-7-21-05 for the signage. Mrs. Mary Moore seconded the motion, and it was unanimously accepted by the commission.

Chairman Carol Rose called Case # 4-7-21-06 for 101 William Street, Mrs. Heidi Johnson. Chairman Carol Rose asked Mrs. Johnson to explain what they were planning to do. Mrs. Johnson stated they were planning on making the existing parking lot where they now have tables they want to put in a floating deck with natural wood. Trying to make it look more aesthetic to put the tables on the boards. She stated it would be a 15 x 18 wood deck stained. Mrs. Johnson stated they are going to the County next month for a beer and wine license. They are required to have a closed in area; they are asking for a natural wood fence to go around it that would be stained. There are a couple of outlets outside looking into doing the LED string lights. They have poles that the lights will hang on and would come back to the building. Mrs. Johnson stated they have an existing window they want to use as a pickup window so if people do not want to come inside, they can use the pickup window. They are going to have it so people can pay at their tables. They are not getting rid of the inside dining area. Mrs. Johnson stated they have put in an eight-seat bar. They also have tables that are in front of the windows. They are trying to open another register, so people do not have to wait. They are trying to expand. Mrs. Mary Moore liked the idea of covering the asphalt. Mrs. Johnson stated they will have a handicap ramp to keep people from tripping. They must run the ramp to the wall. Planning Director Dave Engelhart asked Mrs. Johnson about the location of the window compared to the location of the ramp. Mrs. Johnson stated about 2 to 3 feet away from the ramp. Mr. Engelhart questioned this because he wanted to make sure it would be ADA compliant. He stated there cannot be any obstructions. He commented on the shelf that was located on her drawing and told her if that protruded into that space or location of the ramp for ADA it could not be there.

Mrs. Johnson said the shelf would be there for someone to lay their purse down on. Mr. Engelhart told her the area must be compliant for everyone even people on crutches no matter what Mr. Engelhart stated he would work on this with Mrs. Johnson. Mr. Norman Bunting asked Mrs. Johnson if the decking & fencing would be wood. Mrs. Johnson stated they wanted to tie this all in to make it nice, for the awning she stated she would come back to the commission. Chairman Carol Rose told her to keep in mind if she wants awnings, it would be for the whole building did not think it would look right. Chairman Carol Rose asked her about signage you are not planning on putting any more signage on that building. Mrs. Johnson replied they now have the whole building before there was another business that also had signage on the building. Mrs. Johnson stated she would need a menu board. Mrs. Laura Stearns liked the idea of the walk-up window and thought it showed the town was walkable. Mrs. Mary Moore complimented Mrs. Johnson on her business told her she makes it look attractive. Mr. Robert Poli thought it was great. Mr. Engelhart asked about the lighting would it be off if her business was closed. Mrs. Johnson replied her lights would only be on when they are operating. All members agreed they liked the idea. Chairman Carol Rose called for a motion for Case # 4-7-21-06. Mrs. Laura Stearns made the motion to approve Case # 4-7-21-06 as presented. Mrs. Mary Moore seconded the motion, and it was unanimously accepted by the commission.

Chairman Carol Rose called Case # 4-7-21-07 Buckingham Presbyterian Church, 20 South Main Street requesting one piece of playground equipment. Chairman Carol Rose recused herself and asked Vice Chairman Robert Poli to chair the meeting due to her being a member of the church. Mr. Engelhart asked the applicants to give their names. Mr. Jason Parker, Trustee and Lynsey Aston, Alder of Buckingham Presbyterian Church. Vice Chairman Robert Poli asked if the equipment was going behind the church. He then called on Mr. Norman Bunting. Mr. Bunting stated he had no problem with the playground equipment. Mrs. Laura Stearns stated she was okay with it and was glad they chose a wooden structure. She said she was sad to see the trees go. Mr. Jason Parker stated they were trying to build a youth program. Mrs. Stearns replied she sees a lot more younger people attending. Mrs. Mary Moore asked why they removed the trees. Mr. Parker replied they had to remove the trees to make room for the equipment. Mrs. Moore asked were they going to do landscaping or replant some trees. Mrs. Moore thought Ms. Maloof's letter was well written and talked about the trees in town. Mr. Poli stated that trees help with flooding and is also a buffer he asked that they consider replanting for the neighbors. Mrs. Moore asked if Mr. Engelhart was going to read the letter that was sent in by Ms. Joan Maloof. Mr. Engelhart stated that Ms. Joan Maloof had sent an email to him early in the morning, he read the letter in the meeting to everyone. Vice Chairman Robert Poli called for a motion. Mr. Norman Bunting made the motion to approve Case # 4-7-21-07 for the playground equipment. Mrs. Laura Stearns seconded the motion, and it was unanimously accepted by the commission.

Chairman Carol Rose called Case # 4-7-21-08 for 17 North Main Street, Mr. Michael Cosman requesting signage. Chairman Carol Rose asked each member if they were okay with the signage. All members agreed they liked the sign. Chairman Carol Rose called for a motion for Case # 4-7-21-08. Mr. Robert Poli made the motion to approve Case # 4-7-21-08 for signage. Mr. Norman Bunting seconded the motion, and it was unanimously accepted by the commission.

Mrs. Ivy Wells of Economic Development stated she had heard from the Department of Housing & Community Development for the façade grant that was applied for, for 201 William Street. The Pitts House was approved to be painted and scraped, new windows and siding. Mr. Engelhart stated they give Mrs. Wells the money and then she goes and asks the merchants, they give her their application for the grant. Mrs. Wells stated it is a one-to-one match. Mr. Garret Neeb put in for the grant they are going to scrape and paint and put in new windows. Chairman Carol Rose asked if Garret would come before them. Discussion on how long the property had been owned by the family. Mrs. Wells told the commission that the Rusty Anchor wants to open by Memorial Day. Broad Street Station working hard to get open.

With no other comments Chairman Carol Rose called for a motion to adjourn. Mr. Norman Bunting made the motion to adjourn. Mrs. Mary Moore seconded the motion. Meeting was adjourned at 6:22PM.

We aim to build a community green space with parking and seating for special events and outdoor
dining areas. This would include the construction of a pergola with foliage and plants, and a
permanent fence around the perimeter. A temporary bathroom would be included, as well as four
permanent parking spaces. There would be approximately 10-15 tables with seating (spaced 6+ feet
apart) and an open green space in the center.

6. Samples of materials or copies of manufacturers product literature.




This is a photograph of the current lot. No buildings or structures currently exist on the property.






