### Town of Berlin Historic District Commission March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023

Chairman Norman Bunting called the March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, meeting to order at 5:31PM. Members present were Norman Bunting, Carol Rose, Laura Stearns, Mary Moore, John Holloway and Alternate Brian Robertson. Staff present was Planning Director Dave Engelhart and Permit Coordinator Carolyn Duffy.

Chairman Norman Bunting called for a motion to approve the March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, agenda. Mr. John Holloway made the motion to approve March 1<sup>st</sup>. 2023 agenda. Ms. Carol Rose seconded the motion, and it was unanimously accepted by the commission. Chairman Norman Bunting called for a motion to approve the minutes from the February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, meeting. Mrs. Laura Stearns made the motion to approve the minutes from the February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, meeting. Mr. John Holloway seconded the motion, and it was unanimously accepted by the commission.

Chairman Bunting stated the first item on the agenda was the nomination for Chairman and Vice Chairman which is done yearly. Mrs. Laura Stearns made motion to nominate Mr. Norman Bunting for chairman again. Ms. Carol Rose seconded the motion, and it was unanimously accepted by the commission. Chairman Bunting called for a nomination for Vice Chairman. He stated he would like to nominate Mrs. Laura Stearns for Vice Chairman. Ms. Carol Rose and John Holloway seconded made the motion and it was unanimously accepted by the Commission.

Chairman Bunting stated the next item on the agenda was for case # 3-1-23-03 for 104 Pitts Street, Blacksmiths but had to be taken off tonight they will return at a later date. Chairman Bunting then called the next case #3-1-23-04 The Berlin Horticultural Advisory Board. The members present were Mrs. Andrea Weeg, Mrs. Georgianne McElroy, and Mrs. Hunter Smith. Chairman Bunting asked them to give a summary of what they wanted to do. Mrs. McElroy stated they work under the town they have put in pollinator gardens and flower beds around town to beautify the downtown. They were asked and have come up with this for William Street. They would like to put up window boxes in two of the windows, five planters and benches. Mrs. Andrea Weeg said they would replace the bench in front and put the plaque back on the bench. The Mayor also said he would like plaques on the other benches, but they would figure that out later. Mrs. Moore thought that was creative and impressed with this. Mrs. Stearns stated that spot for the town is a good photo spot. Chairman Bunting asked if the bench in the photo the same style as what is there now. Mrs. Stearns thought the iron on the benches complemented the flower boxes.

Mrs. McElroy stated there would be consistency but didn't want everything to match. The variety that they plant will carry over to Commerce Street where the mural flower bed is located. Mrs. Stearns asked how they would water the plants. Mrs. McElroy stated Cody has a water truck. There are voluntaries in the summer to water the plants. They really try to select plants that are drought tolerant and that don't need a lot of water. Mrs. Moore said in Nantucket they had a truck that went through the town and watered hanging baskets. Mrs. Ivy Wells of Economic Development stated this is all grant funded from the Main Street Improvement. They wanted to improve William Street with benches and flowers and baskets. The light poles have

been on back order for a year now. Baskets are in her shopping cart right now just waiting for it to get approved so they can be ordered. Planning Director Dave Engelhart asked would the benches be green. Mrs. Well said they would be brown because black gets too hot. Mr. Engelhart asked if they had checked when the benches are against the wall are they a minimum of three foot for ADA compliance along the sidewalk. Mrs. McElroy said they had measured. Mr. Engelhart stated it was a little wider along there. Members thought it would be beautiful. Mrs. Wells stated they are the wrap around baskets instead of the lamp post baskets that they had come before the commission for the last time. These will be set a little lower so you can see the flowers in the baskets.

Ms. Carol Rose made the motion to approve Case # 3-1-2023-04 for the benches, planters, and baskets. Mr. John Holloway seconded the motion, and it was unanimously accepted by the commission.

Mrs. Wells stated that the town had received \$50,000.00 dollars in façade grant funding. Economic Development releases the grant money. They ran out last year, so she has been contacting people and they are applying for more than what they have. They are setting a deadline of April 14<sup>th</sup> for anyone who wants to apply for funding. Get the applications to them so they can be reviewed. Whatever they decide, the application will get approved by MHT first then it would go to Dave to be presented to the commission. Ms. Rose asked if they don't get the project finished, they do pay the money back. Ms. Wells stated it's a reversible grant they pay for everything then submit the receipts and invoices. If not completed in a year, they forfeit the grant, and the money can go to someone else. Mr. Matt Amey of 8 Jefferson Street asked if they could start the work before they apply. Mrs. Well's replied no.

Mr. John Lane just took over Globe at the beginning of the month and wanted to come to address the Tiki Bar. Just took that over three days ago. He stated that is not how he runs his business. Wanted to go over the steps to get the wall rebuilt. Half of the days of the year are cold and that destroys the business. Went to see Mr. Engelhart on Monday. Mrs. Moore told him she knew his family and didn't know he was a chef. Ms. Rose stated they would be glad to work with him and happy to have him in town. Chairman Bunting said on serious business Mr. Engelhart told you nothing can be brought back to the board for approval until the fence has been constructed. He stated we were brought together on a special night to get this approved and it was not done. It's been three years when the freezer was put in that was a stipulation that a fence would cover it up. So now we must have the fence, or the freezer must go. Chairman said he could show him what was approved and then you can have stuff behind the fence but not trash. Willing to work with you. Ms. Rose stated it was a 6-foot fence we approved and easy to construct. Mr. Lane stated he was trying to get in and open tomorrow. He wanted to bring this to them next month. Ms. Rose replied from the last meeting the motion was nothing can be done or approved until the fence is put up. Mr. Brian Robertson asked could he bring the fence and the revisions for the Tiki Bar to the next meeting to get approved all at once. Mrs. Stearns asked if he could put the wall back up for the winter. Mr. Lane said it's a hole in the wall and his pipes are exposed. Mr. Lane stated he had to put up a tarp to help with the weather. Mr. Engelhart said he was coming next month, and you could stipulate the fence goes up first. Discussion continued. Chairman Bunting said he would come see him in a couple of days to talk. They gave permission for him to do what he needed to do to get open, cover up in the back and keep it safe. Chairman asked

him to work with them they want to see the business succeed. Mr. Lane said the Health Department comes at 1:00PM and after that they will open. Mr. Brian Robertson asked would the name change. Mr. Lane replied no the Tiki Bar keeps the same name and the Globe which is in his contract. He said he was planning on bringing brunch back on Sundays. Mr. Engelhart asked if he goes before the liquor board on the 15th of the month. Chairman asked if there were any more comments from the commissioners. Ms. Rose asked about the scaffolding at Pitts' house. Mrs. Moore asked about the Franklin Ave property. Mr. Engelhart told the history of the house and what had happened to the property since. With no comments from chairman, he asked his members to stay professional and said they had a job to do asked by mayor & council and that's what they will do. Each member has a different opinion and that's why they are here. Mr. Engelhart told them Mr. Selway would be back next month he believed with the new changes to drawings. Mr. Matt Amey said he came thinking Mr. Selway would be on the agenda tonight. He stated he is in support of him developing that property, he said they need more business in that area. He told the commission he wants to get on the agenda for next month for windows he wants to put in two picture windows in front, so it looks more like a business than a residential house and add another doorway. But will discuss it next month.

Chairman asked he bring in a sample of the window or manufactures paperwork for the windows. Chairman called for a motion to adjourn. Ms. Carol Rose made the motion to adjourn. Mr. John Holloway seconded the motion, and it was accepted by the commission.


Current view of porch windows and door.





Commercial entrance door and picture windows.






Proposed new door location.

1. Site plan.
2. Scaled drawings of plans and/or elevations of the proposal, or in the alternative, a scale model.
3. Color photographs of the existing structure, the area to be altered and close-ups of architectural details.
4. For a proposed new structure, photographs of the subject site and all buildings in the immediate vicinity.
5. All photographs shall be printed on $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ paper or provided in digital format, and shall be labeled with a description of the contents of the photographs.
6. Samples of materials or copies of manufacturers product literature.
