Parks Commission Meeting Minutes Tuesday, November 7, 2023

5:30 PM REGULAR SESSION – Berlin Town Hall Conference Room

Commission Members Present: Chair Mike Wiley, Patricia Dufendach, Kristen Gerhart, Sarah Hooper, and Laura Stearns

Staff Present: Public Works Superintendent Cody Chesser and Administrative Assistant Kate Daub

Others Present: Berlin Horticultural Advisory Committee Member Georgianna McElroy, Resident Lara Mulvaney

This meeting was also broadcast live via Facebook and called to order by Administrative Assistant Kate Daub at approximately 5:30 PM.

Ms. Patricia Dufendach moved to approve the meeting minutes of September 5, 2023. Mr. Mike Wiley seconded, and approval was unanimous.

Ms. Daub began the meeting by asking the Commission members if they would approve of a change to the meeting agenda. She noted that Berlin Horticultural Advisory Committee (HAC) member Ms. Georgiana McElroy was present at the meeting to discuss the HAC's proposed plan for tree planting at Stephen Decatur Park and suggested they allow Ms. McElroy to present the information at the start of the meeting; all Commission members agreed.

Ms. McElroy explained the HAC is proposing the addition of twelve trees to Stephen Decatur Park. She shared that town resident Mr. Edward Hammond has donated White Oak trees and the HAC hopes to add Bald Cypress, Princeton Elms, and Redbud trees as well. Ms. McElroy referred to the aerial map of the park included in the meeting packet and stated the project would include placing Bald Cypress trees along Route 113 as a buffer. She acknowledged that stormwater management and mitigation in the area is important but said she believes there is plenty of space for three Cypress trees. She continued by saying there is a significant amount of dead wood located in the canopy section of the park and recommends it be removed.

Once cleared, Ms. McElroy proposed adding Princeton Elms in its place, as the species is resistant to Dutch Elm disease and would grow well in the area. Due to the possible future addition of a Comfort Station in the park, the HAC recommends putting the Redbud trees in last. She noted the HAC is proposing the addition of Redbuds around the Comfort Station and suggests they wait to do so until construction is complete. Lastly, Ms. McElroy said the HAC would like to add a Bald Cypress tree along the edge of the tree line near the ditch on the west side of the park; she clarified that there is currently a White Pine tree in the area that should be removed. Ms. Dufendach said she recalls a discussion that was had years prior regarding planting in the area between the ditch and Kenwood Court; she said certain species of pine had

been planted but failed. She stated she is not opposed to the Bald Cypress suggested, adding she feels the proposed plan would be a great replacement.

Ms. Laura Stearns said she is particularly interested in the buffer along Route 113 and shared that she feels it would improve the air quality and aesthetics of the park, as well as serve as a safety barrier between the park and the highway. She suggested they consider adding more Bald Cypresstrees to the area so that the barrier can run the entire length of the park along the roadway. Resident Lara Mulvaney was present at the meeting and said she is very interested in stormwater management. She explained she has researched the town stormwater report that shows a lot of the highway drainage is both northbound and southbound of Route 113, south of the Berlin Police Station, and part of Decatur Street and confirmed all stormwater from those areas is all draining through the park. Ms. Mulvaney said she would like to suggest the Parks Commission support and encourage the town to discuss a potential stormwater management project along Route 113 with the State Highway Administration (SHA).

Ms. McElroy asked if Ms. Mulvaney's recommendation would require the land to be free from planting until stormwater issues are addressed; Ms. Mulvaney answered that it would likely be a complicated process for SHA to agree to such a project given that the land belongs to the town. However, she said she believes the issue is worth pursuing and thinks the addition of trees is part of the solution. Public Works Superintendent Cody Chesser emphasized that a stormwater management discussion should be had with members of the Water Resources Department and the town's stormwater consultants. He continued by saying the proposed tree plan for the park has no bearing on any stormwater discussions to be had.

Ms. McElroy said the trees can be placed in certain spots to not impose on the existing channel that runs through the park, adding that the new trees will eventually help withstormwater issues in the area. Ms. Dufendach acknowledged the effects stormwater is having on the park but said she does not see why the trees proposed would be a problem in the areas east of the pathway. She said the tree proposal is a wonderful place to start and is excited to explore the possibilities involving the addition of other plants that will only help stormwater management. Ms. McElroy said she hopes the tree proposal will allow the town to pursue a level two arboretum status, adding that certain criteria must be met for accreditation.

Following a motion by Ms. Sarah Hooper to approve the proposed tree plan for Stephen Decatur Park and seconded by Ms. Dufendach, the Parks Commission voted unanimously in favor of the plan presented.

Ms. Daub continued by reporting that pickleball lines have been added to the courts at Stephen Decatur Park. Consequently, she said some of the signs placed on the fence and gate that surrounds the court may need updating. She clarified the "Court Rules" sign and the "Tennis Courts Only" sign specifically may need to be revised due to the addition of lines that now allow for Pickleball play. Following a lengthy discussion, the Commission members agreed that new signs were needed; the Commission opted to move forward with signs that permit racquetball play at the courts and added rules applicable to the various uses of the courts.

Ms. Daub asked the Commission if there was a desire to change the start time of their meetings as they come into the new year; she explained the group is not obligated to meet at a specific time and can alter the time to accommodate the members' schedules. All Commission members agreed that an earlier start time would be of interest and opted to meet one hour earlier. Beginning January 2, 2024, the Parks Commission meetings will take place at 4:30 PM as opposed to 5:30 PM.

Before the conclusion of the meeting, Ms. Dufendach asked to revisit the stormwater issues at Stephen Decatur Park. She said she had made a previous complaint to SHA who sent a crewmember that took pictures of the small ditch collecting water from the east side. However, she said she would like to speak with the town about the problem further; she said it is important to address the flooding problems that continue to occur at the park due to the overrun of highway water. Ms. Daub said she would make Water Resources Director Jamey Latchum aware of her concern and ask if any action can be taken.
